Did you know?

- All Writtle College degree programmes are validated by the University of Essex, one of the UK's leading universities.
- There is onsite accommodation for up to 400 students, equipped with internet access for students bringing their own laptop or computer.
- Over the last six years, Writtle graduates have gained an employability rating of 94% in the first six months after graduation. This is above average for UK universities.
- The two-day 'V' music festival is held in Hylands Park just down the road from Writtle College, which has brought the likes of Scissor Sisters, Keane and Faithless to the village.
- Writtle College students may be given financial assistance towards the cost of childcare facilities on campus.
- The campus has a lively community atmosphere with students from over 50 different countries.

How to find us

Writtle College is situated on Lordship Road, just 2 miles west of Chelmsford.

The College is 30 miles from London and the train journey from Liverpool Street by rail takes about 40 minutes. A regular bus service operates between Chelmsford and Writtle village, which is approximately 10 minutes walk from the main campus.

By road the College is clearly signposted from the A414 Writtle by-pass. If approaching from the east, take the A1060 Sawbridgeworth Road from Chelmsford, as far as Lordship Road and follow the signposts to the College.
