The PSEL 1 English course was useful for the main course. All teachers are very friendly and kind, so I have really enjoyed Writtle life so far. We had also had


opportunities to speak with local people and we had fun every weekend.

PSEL 1

Duration: 10 weeks + 1 week mid-course break

Dates: 25th June – 27th July 2012

(28th July – 5th August study break)

6th August – 7th September 2012

Tuition Fee: £2,050 10 weeks of intensive language course at Writtle College

Accommodation: £1,375 11 weeks accommodation on campus (single en-suite room) 10 meals per week in the Garden Room (restaurant on campus)

Duration: 5 Weeks

Dates: 6th August – 7th September 2012

Tuition Fee: £1,125 Five weeks of intensive language course

Entry to main course of study after Pre-Sessional English Language (PSEL) programme

For Foundation /Further Education Students

Entry to your main course of study is dependent on successful completion of the PSEL programme. This is defined as 80% attendance and submitting all assignments to a satisfactory level. The course manager will have final authority in deciding this.

For Undergraduate / Postgraduate Students:

We are required by the UK Border Agency to ensure that your standard of English has improved before we can allow continuation onto your main academic course. We will make all the necessary arrangements to ensure you comply with these rules and will support you throughout the process.

About the courses

PSEL 1

This study programme offers the opportunity for considerable improvement in the level of your English language before the start of your main course. Initially it provides systematic language practice in grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation to develop fluency in communication. The later focus is on the use of academic English and the skills – listening, reading, writing – needed for study in higher education in the UK.

The programme of cultural visits to places such as London, Cambridge and Canterbury, is an integral part of this course.

PSEL 2

This intensive course aims to give you confidence before the start of your main course. As well as improving the general language, it provides the opportunity for familiarisation with and practice in the academic language and skills needed for study at a British university.

The one week gap between PSEL1 and PSEL2 will enable students to travel within the UK. Students commencing a Higher Education course at Writtle after the PSEL course will need to pay for one extra week's accommodation.

The 'overall score' detailed above is set by our English course manager; our experience has shown that this will give you the best chance of successful completion.

*The 'with no less than' scores detailed above for **Further Education and Foundation courses**, are determined by UKBA and refer to scores defined by the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) B1.*

CEFR B1 is the minimum English proficiency required by UKBA for students coming to the UK to study pre-sessional courses.
